## The Port of Morgan City Provides Logistical Advantages

The Port of Morgan City, located on the South-Central LA Gulf Coast between New Orleans and Lafayette, LA, at the intersection of the Atchafalaya River and the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway, offers a multi-modal transportation network for its industrial clients.

- Waterway access in 4 directions
- a 20' deep by 400' wide Congressionally authorized channel from Morgan City south to the Gulf of Mexico
- 4-lane U S Hwy 90 (Future I-49)
- BNSF & UP Class 1 rail service



The Port is uniquely situated to ship and receive cargo throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean.

## The Port of Morgan City Marine Terminal

**The Port of Morgan City Marine Terminal** located at 800 Youngs Road, Morgan City, LA (GIWW WHL Mile Marker 95), can handle bulk, break-bulk, project and container cargoes.

- 800' dock with 20' water depth (additional 1000' mooring area)
- 20,000 sq. ft. warehouse and yard storage available



Rail spurs on site are serviced by Louisiana and Delta Short Line. The Port completed a rail repair and enhancement project in January 2020.

## Port Expansion Planned

Construction is expected to begin on the East Dock Expansion at the 800 Youngs Road port terminal facility around September of 2022. The East Dock Expansion will increase loading/off loading and laydown area.

The initial phase of a Western Dock Expansion is also being planned, with an estimated date to go out for bid for the construction of this project is around March 2023 and construction estimated to take about 2 years. The West Dock Expansion will provide 1900 feet of finished waterfront access. The Port will have over 30 acres available for use with 11 acres on the waterfront.
